CJW ARTS & CRAFTS CONTEST PROCEDURES & RULES

Please Note: Every contestant must receive a COMPLETE copy of the entry procedures, contest rules and categories. Arts & Crafts Competition Chairs should be familiar with the procedures & rules.

Preparing for the Contest

1. Carefully match your entry to a category. For example, *under "6. Basketry, a. creation of a basket, 1. natural,"* the judges will consider your basket making skills, not the painted decoration.
2. Each entry must be accompanied by three 3 x 5 index cards, with the following information typed or printed legibly. The cards MUST be attached SECURELY to the item.

Front of the card

1. Complete classification description. The code means nothing to a judge.
2. Detailed description of the item including size, color, etc.

Entry Procedures

A contestant will prepare her entry cards and securely attach on the contest item. If that card is lost or damaged, she must replace it before the next competition. She will give the remaining two cards to the **CLUB Arts Chair**.

- The Club Arts Chair will keep one card from each entry for her records.

CJW ARTS & CRAFTS CONTEST PROCEDURES & RULES

Contest Rules

1. Any person who has earned a total of \$300.00 in any year from teaching or selling her craft will be considered a professional and cannot enter that category. She is eligible to compete in any other category.
2. An entry must have been completed during the previous 12 months.
3. Any entry that is categorized incorrectly or is not accompanied by a properly completed entry card will be disqualified. Note categories that require additional information on cards.
4. Entries in "Miscellaneous" Category must be a new craft or skill not included in the CJW Categories. Card must include a brief description of the craft or skill.

Step by Step How to Organize the Club Craft Competition

1. Please read and distribute copies of the competition procedures, rules and categories to all members. Read the judging criteria too. If you have any questions, check all instructions. If your question is not answered, call your CJW Arts Chairperson.
2. Most clubs hold their craft competition during their January or February meetings. You may want to have a special Arts Night event as a way of "dressing up" the competition and encouraging participation.
3. Arrange for your judges. Clubs can use their discretion about the number of judges. Try to find judges in popular fields (i.e., photography, needlework, general crafts, etc.) No club member, officer or relative of a contestant can be a judge.
4. Get prize ribbons or fashion ones from gold stickers and ribbon. Blue should be used for first place, red for second place, and yellow or gold for third place. Honorable mention can also be given out at the club level.
5. Be sure each entry has entry cards as described in the contest procedure. Entries without cards or cards that do not use the specified format will be disqualified.
6. Be sure each entry is categorized correctly. It will be hard to question members of your own club but is for their own good. Entries that are in the wrong category will be disqualified.
7. Give a copy of the judging criteria to each of your judge, preferably in advance so they can review it.
8. Be sure someone accompanies your judges during their work because they may, need help. For example, should a judge feel that an item entered as an original is an adaptation, the judging criterion tells them to inform the organizer so she can question the crafter or someone from the crafter's club. It is traditional to give small presents or flowers as a token of the club's appreciation.

CJW ARTS & CRAFTS CONTEST PROCEDURES & RULES

Judging Criteria for Club Judges

1. Please note the category as you judge. For example, an entry in the "creation of a basket" category should be judged for basket making skills, not for painted decoration or other detail.
2. If you feel an item is categorized incorrectly, it must be eliminated from the competition. You may not move it to the proper category.
3. Contest Definitions are as follows:
 - **Original**
Independently designed and executed
 - **Kit**
Something that is purchased and assembled from instructions
 - **Adaptation**
Adaptations, modifications, or adjustments to something purchased.
(example, changing a kit design or selecting a color scheme for a stamp canvas.)
 - **Sizes**
Large -- For sewing, group projects, items must be larger than three feet.
All other categories must be larger than 12 inches.

Small -- For sewing, group projects, items must be smaller than three feet.
All other categories must be smaller than 12 inches.
4. You are to award first (blue), second (red), and third (yellow) ribbons. Honorable mention awards may also be given. Ties are not permitted. This is an amateur competition. Our goal is to encourage participation.
5. Please disqualify yourself as a judge if you are related to an entrant or are a CJW member of any club.
6. The Miscellaneous category is intended for new crafts or skills not included in CJW categories. Please award 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.
