Enjoy the New Year and welcome 2010! and another chance for you to continue to increase your efforts to save the environment.

Recycled Card Program--several clubs have done this for many years but for those of you looking for new ways to recycle greeting cards, here is the information. St. Jude's Ranch for Children will be accepting used, all-occasion cards thru February 28, 2010. Over thirty years ago, wishing to show their appreciation to their donors, St. Jude's Ranch turned the previous year's Christmas cards into "new" cards for the next season. The recipients were so delighted with the unique cards that they requested the children sell the "new" cards to them. Thus the program was born and has now expanded to all forms of greeting cards. The program is very simple; just remove the front of the card to send to them. The children attach a new back and a beautiful new card has been made. The benefits are two-fold; the customers receive "green" holiday cards for use and the children receive payment for their work and learn the benefits and importance of "going green."

Happy New Year!

This is a time when many people resolve to improve in the coming year. Allow me to suggest a resolution for each of your clubs. Resolve that your club will submit reports on all of your projects to the CJW Department Chairs and that those reports will be complete, correctly presented, easily read and understood by those Department Chairs. You have about 2 1/2 months to get these reports in shape on all projects done since March 1, 2009.

Here are some things to remember about the proper presentation of those reports.

1. All clubs MUST submit a President's Report.
2. Remember to refer to the Report Writing Guidelines in the Blue Book, or sent separately by CJW Corresponding Secretary, Lois Wack, for the physical presentation of the reports.
3. ALL REPORTS MUST BE ON ONE OF THE FORMS FOUND IN THE BLUE BOOK!
4. Project Reports must be no longer than one page. Anything over one page will not be judged.
5. Remember that it is the intent of the project that determines in which department the project should be reported.
6. All projects must have been completed between March 1, 2009 and February 28, 2010.
7. Use your full, proper club name on all pages.
8. Give as much information as possible, especially about any local organizations that the CJW Chairs might not know.
